Missions Report: Trelawny, Jamaica

True Worshippers Kingdom Ministries partnered with **Agape Love World Wide Ministries - Love in Action** to accomplish The Granville Project 2025, under the leadership of Minister Arlene Owens (affectionately known as Minister Candy).

This was my very first mission trip to Jamaica, ministering to the girls at the Granville Child Care Facility. By God's grace, Minister Candy and I arrived on December 24, 2025.

The goal of this mission was simple yet powerful: to bring love, hope, peace, confidence, encouragement, and the love of God to both the residents and the staff of Granville Child Care Facility.

Granville Child Care Facility is also known as Granville Place of Safety, is located in Trelawny, Jamaica. It serves as a safe haven for girls ages 8-18 who have experienced abuse, abandonment, or neglect. The facility provides love, security, and holistic care through education, vocational training, counseling, and life skills development. The focus is healing, restoration, and empowerment, helping these young women rebuild their lives and prepare for reintegration into society.

Travel & Transportation

Minister Candy traveled with seven suitcases and miraculously, she didn't have to pay a single fee to transport them to Jamaica. God provided three different rides options for her from the Ocho Rios airport to Hayes. God also provided my transportation from Kingston airport to Hayes, Clarendon, completely at no cost. All I can say is what a mighty God we serve.

Lodging

Once again, God showed up. He provided housing for us for the entire trip. When we arrived at the home where we would be staying, I was greeted by Minister Candy and the warm, welcoming smiles of Deacon Anderson and Deaconess Anderson, effectively known as mommy and daddy Anderson. They were loving, kind, and truly beautiful people of God. From the very beginning, they made me feel like family.

We didn't just have a comfortable place to stay but we had our own bedrooms, fellowship, and hearts that immediately connected. It's a beautiful thing when God brings people together and your spirits just mesh. It honestly felt like I had known them my whole life.

The first couple of days were spent unpacking all the suitcases. We had clothing, hygiene products, lotion, deodorant, etc. just a little bit of everything. Once everything was sorted, we created individual gift bags for each resident at Granville, along with gift bags filled with food and essential items for the staff. All I can say is to God be the glory!



Granville Child Care Facility Visit

Bright and early on Saturday morning we headed to Trelawny. As we arrived safely at Granville, we noticed a church right next door to the facility that was terribly damaged from Hurricane Melissa. Only one full wall and part of another were still standing; the rest had crumbled. Yet inside that broken structure, the church members were worshiping and singing praises to God.

It absolutely blew my mind. Despite the damage, they were grateful just to have a place to worship. It was humbling and powerful. God received all the glory. It reminded me that we must live a life of gratitude no matter what comes our way. We praised God for His goodness, His grace, and for sparing lives during the hurricane.

As we drove onto the Granville property, the damage from Hurricane Melissa was evident. The hurricane had clearly passed through the facility.

We were greeted with open arms and gratitude by the program administrator and most of the staff. They helped us carry the bags inside and gave us free range to present to the girls. We set up tables with arts and crafts and snacks. We introduced ourselves to the resident and Deacon Anderson opened in prayer. He and I led worship through song, even letting the girls choose some of the songs. It was a sweet moment of worship together.

I shared words of encouragement, reminding the girls the importance of have a relationship with God and how we build that relationship through prayer, reading the Bible, singing praises, and simply communicating our feelings to Him. Deaconess Anderson also shared words of encouragement to the girls.

We were later joined by Sister Hines from Abundant Life Ministry. Minister Owens will have to share how God divinely connected her with the Hines family. Pastor and Sister Hines opened their church doors to us for the night with so much love. They are kind, generous kingdom minded people of God who simply wanted to server.

After a long day of travel and ministry, they provided us with a hot meal at the right time. God knew exactly what we needed and connected us with the perfect people to meet our needs. We had warm food, hot showers, and a safe place to rest. Pastor Hines even left his office door open so everyone could have a warm shower. It's sometimes the little things that shows you the heart of a man or woman.

Some of us slept in the sanctuary by pushing seats together, some on an air mattress, and others on a couch, but we all slept well, to the glory of God. The next morning, we woke up to hot breakfast prepared by Sister Hines. All I could kept saying was, God is so good.

Returning to Granville

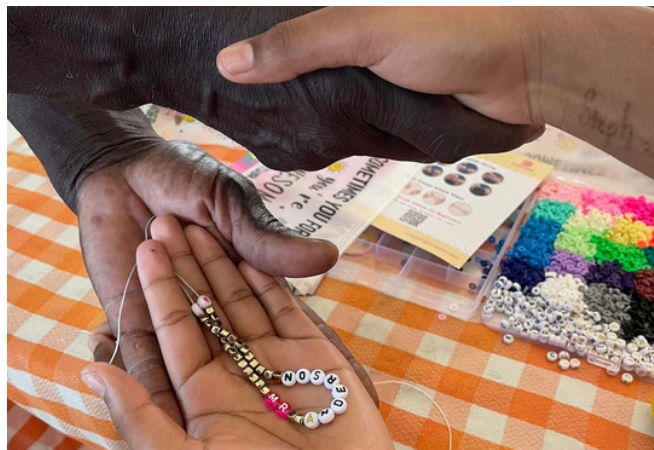
We returned to Granville to worship with the girls again, share lunch, and distribute the gifts. Sister Hines encouraged the girls by sharing the story of Joseph, a story the girls can deeply related to. She reminded them to believe in their dreams and not let anyone stop them from dreaming and not to believe the words and actions of the enemy.



Minister Owens also shared words of encouragement. It was gift giving time. Each girl received a personal handwritten card and a gift bag filled with a journal, pen, perfume spray, bonnets, ChapStick, books about God's love, and other thoughtful items. Each staff member also received a gift bag with food, lotion, oil, and a small jar containing a mustard seed.

Minister Candy explained having faith the size of a mustard seed can move mountains. Smiles spread across every face. Everyone felt seen. Everyone felt valued, even those who were initially standoffish couldn't help but smile.

I praise God that we were able to be there to simply bring joy, to let the girls and staff know that people across the sea in America were thinking of them, praying for them, and moved by God to show His love in a tangible way. His love overwhelms me. To know that He used us to reflect His love to others is humbling beyond words.



Mission Accomplished but Yet My Heart Remains Heavy

As we headed back to Clarendon, it felt like a holy culmination. All the prayers, planning, giving, sacrifices, acts of kindness, energy, laughter, and worship had come together. The mission was accomplished. We truly served as the hands and feet of Jesus at the Granville Child Care Facility in Trelawny, Jamaica.

I have always had a heart for missionary work. God has consistently used me to speak into lives, connect people to resources, and provide what is needed in the moment. This trip affirmed that calling once again.

As we prepared to leave, my emotions were mixed. I was deeply grateful for the opportunity to serve, yet burdened knowing there is still so much more help needed for the current girls at Granville and for those who will come after them.

Driving through Hayes, Clarendon, I saw so many young men sitting outside or on porches with nothing productive to do. Traveling through the mountains of Trelawny, I saw even more children and families in need. I know we can't help everyone but putting faces to the need leaves a weight on my heart.

And still, I trust God. He sees them. He loves them. And He will continue the work He started.
